

Teacher-Chaperone Responsibilities

- 1) Participate fully in all activities, but let students take the lead in questioning our leaders. This does not mean don't ask, it just means allow the student voice to be heard first during activities.
- 2) Lodging, meals, transportation during the event, and teaching materials provided.
- 3) Will act as chaperone for 6-10 students.
- 4) Educators will support the element leaders in chaperoning 6-10 students.
- 5) Your element group leader will be in charge of the group, but your support is welcomed to assist in participation and behavior monitoring of students.
- 6) Alert the teacher liaison with any behavioral or medical concerns that cannot be remedied in the small groups.
- 7) Upon return to the evening lodging and meeting space, meet as a group with the teacher liaison to discuss how experiences during the youth summit can be effectively incorporated into the classroom setting.
- 8) Assist with the evening monitoring of students as needed until lights out.
- 9) Digital resources to support instruction, primary sources and other resources will be supplied to teachers in order to further the student experience.
- 10) Complete recommendations at the end of the youth summit, focusing on how this material can be used in the classroom setting. These recommendations will be shared with leaders following the summit along with the student recommendations.
